Mathematics

This year we plan to continue to develop students' skills in mathematical understanding, fluency, problem solving and reasoning. In Term 1, our focus is to develop students' skills in place value and pattern to create a solid mathematical foundation for the year ahead. We will be engaging in Big Ideas in Number games and activities to support students subitising and place value strategies.

Literacy

This term we will continue to develop students understanding of phonics and morphology and how this works to progress our reading, writing and understanding of words.

We'll see our phonics/morphology knowledge used within our work of close reading and how to really derive meaning from texts.

For writing we'll be exploring the genre of Narrative, learning how to write a structured story to narrate while showing skills of editing and understanding of grammar.

HASS

In HASS this term students will be exploring History through different celebrations and commemorations globally and around Australia. Through this learning students will gain knowledge of historical concepts and skills such as significance, perspective, and empathy.

Science

This term in science our students will be focusing on water cycles, learning how to identify water sources and describe key processes in the water cycle, including movement of water through the sky, landscape and ocean. As we introduce a new group of students to the 'Our Big Backyard' project we'll be able to identify the significance of the Little Para River and how this water way serves our community.
