Mathematics

Throughout this term the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division will be covered. Measurement will be explored this term along with time, length, distance and data. We will be exploring this through our theme of flight.

Literacy

Throughout Term 2 the students will relate ideas; express opinion, preferences and appreciation of texts; and include relevant details from learnt topics, topics of interest or texts. They group, logically sequence and link ideas. They will use language features including topic-specific vocabulary, and/or visual features and features of voice.

HASS

In HASS this term students will be exploring History and the past experiences of Australia. This will explore History of the First Nation's People, and British colonisation.

Science

Throughout term 2 we are focusing on forces and looking at design thinking and the design process. This will allow us to be prepared for term 3 learning when we are exploring the Paralympics.

Health & PE

Welcome to Term 2, I hope you all had a relaxing break. This term during the PE/Health program your child will experience and explore various skills/techniques, rules and concepts involved with a range of sports and games.

PE: Movement techniques, throw, catch, run, dodge, jump and spatial awareness

Health: Plan and practise strategies to promote health, safety and wellbeing.

3-4 Arts

This term in the arts students will be continuing their work with visual before moving onto media art. Students will then get to take some inspiration from their peers and work on animating the sculptures designed and created by the younger students.
