Mathematics

This term we will be exploring chance and data. Students will experiment with different scenarios and predict outcomes. They will then present the outcomes of their findings through data collection and represent them in graphs. Students will be investigating location and transformation by using map coordinates and cartesian plane. Student will identify the different values of coins and notes and develop skills in making change from different amounts and will create simple budgets.

Literacy

This term we will continue to develop students understanding of phonics and morphology and how this works to progress our reading, writing and understanding of words.

We'll see our phonics/morphology knowledge used within our work of close reading and how to really derive meaning from texts.

For writing we'll be exploring instructional texts, learning how to write a procedures in sequential order and include language features such as; conjunctions, paragraphs, and topic specific vocabulary.

HASS

In HASS this term students will be exploring Geography and making links to the Paralympics games. Students will explore different continents and the countries within them.

Science

This term in science our students will be focusing on materials and their properties for durability and purpose. Students will explore different material types through a design process for creating prosthetic limb. This also links to our HASS topic and the Paralympic Games.

Health & PE

During PE lessons in Term 3, the year 3/4 students will engage in a mini-Olympics unit, where they'll participate in various athletic events, fostering teamwork, sportsmanship, and physical fitness. They will also be learning volleyball as the sport focus this term

In health lessons, students will be learning about social skills and managing relationships. This includes how to get along with others and communicate effectively, as well as empathy, diversity and respect.
