Mathematics

This term we are learning about time, chance, data, location, and transformation. We are consolidating our learning of time.

Chance: We will introduce probability, helping students understand the likelihood of different events occurring.

Data: Students will learn how to collect, organise, and interpret data. They will create and analyse charts and graphs, understanding how data can be used to make decisions and predictions.

Location and Transformation

Location: Our lessons will cover the basics of geography and mapping. Students will learn to read maps, use cardinal directions (North, South, East, West), and understand coordinates.

Transformation: This topic involves understanding shapes and how they can change. Students will explore concepts like rotation, reflection, and translation of shapes. They'll see how shapes can move and transform while still retaining their basic properties.

Literacy

This term we are focusing on instructional texts. Instructional texts are writings designed to help us learn how to do something. Students will learn step-by-step directions or explanations to guide us through a process. These texts are very useful in everyday life, whether we are cooking a new recipe, building a model, or playing a new game.

HASS

Throughout this term we are looking at Geography and doing so through a project focusing on the Olympics and Paralympics. We are combining science/HASS together. Students are learning about Paris, the different countries that are represented at the Olympics, medal counts, athlete profiles and so much more. Students will learn about classifications of Paralympics connecting to ethics.

Science

Throughout Science we are learning about materials and their properties. We will focus on our project of designing and creating a prosthetic leg and explaining why we used certain materials.

Health & PE - John

Welcome to Term 3! I hope you all had a relaxing break. This term in the PE/Health program, your child will explore various skills, techniques, rules, and concepts involved in a range of sports and games. In PE, students will start with class and school routines and expectations in Week 1. From Weeks 2 to 4, they'll participate in various Olympic Games events during athletics. Weeks 5 to 7 will focus on volleyball, where they'll learn game rules, positions, various shots, and gameplay. In Weeks 8 and 9, students will practice different skipping techniques, and in Week 10, they'll finish off and review what they've learned.

In Health, the first four weeks will cover class routines and strategies to make the classroom and playground healthy, safe, and active spaces. From Weeks 5 to 8, students will participate in outdoor games and activities to examine how participation promotes a connection the community, natural environments, and health and wellbeing. Finally, in Weeks 9 and 10, they'll research their own heritage and cultural identities and explore strategies to respect and value diversity. Looking forward to a great term ahead!
